# Itinerary



- Day 1:** Depart Lusaka in the morning with an arranged Road Transfer to Musekese Camp (5-6 hour drive). Arriving in the centre of the Northern part of the Kafue National Park at the Kafue River, boat across to camp, unwind & relax with a sundowner and dinner.
- Day 2-3:** With the assistance of your guide, daily activities for your stay at Musekese will be scheduled to suit your needs. With a focus on walking safaris and boating, game drives are also an option. Tasty food will compliment your customized itinerary at Musekese.
- Day 4:** Enjoy breakfast at the Camp before a morning transfer (game) drive to KaingU Safari Lodge (4 hour drive, plus 10min boat). Arrive at the lodge in time for lunch by the rivers edge, followed by a siesta, afternoon boat cruise, sundowner and dinner.
- Day 5-6:** Whilst relaxing at KaingU, delicious meals and snacks accompany your diverse activity options including game drives, boat cruises, canoeing, fishing, nature & rock walks, a visit to a local school or recreational time. With the assistance of your guide, customise activities that suit your needs.
- Day 7:** Breakfast is served early, before your departure back to Lusaka (Road Transfer: 4-5 hours) or to your next destination.

## MUSEKESE CAMP

'Musekese' is the local Kaonde name for the most ubiquitous tree species in the area, the Monkey-Bread Tree or *Bauhinia thonningii*. The camp is situated on a small ridge overlooking a long and open seasonally inundated floodplain (dambo), beyond which is the main Kafue River. Musekese has a special feel, the sounds of the bush are in full flow, with leopard coughing at night, hippo snorting and the eerie call of the Scops owl, all adding to the 'bush orchestra' that plays out 24 hours of the day.

The camp itself comprises of just four very well appointed 'Machaba' safari tents, complete with comfortable beds, soft linens and locally sourced wooden furnishings. Open air en-suite bathrooms come with traditional wood warmed bucket showers and flushing toilets, combining style with practicality for a comfortable stay.

Bush chef Newton creates fantastic cuisine literally from a hole in the ground, baking fresh bread to compliment locally sourced ingredients to produce healthy filling breakfasts, wholesome brunches and incredible three course evening dinners.

A typical day at the Musekese site can include any of a number of exciting activities all dedicated to getting the most out of your time; from boat cruises along the unhurried Kafue river and its tributaries searching for elusive and rare birds such as the Pel's Fishing Owl and African Finfoot, to walking safaris where the smells, textures and undulations of the 'real' Africa are experienced in a more immersive manner. Open game drive vehicles allow guests to get up close and personal with the larger animals of the Kafue. And one must not forget the viewing hides and blinds, strategically hidden away, where you can relax and wait for the wildlife and birds to come to you - a fantastic and unique way to enjoy the bush.

# KaingU Safari Lodge



## KAINGU SAFARI LODGE



Set in an area of pristine wilderness, KaingU Safari Lodge offers a magnificent safari experience in the heart of the African bush. KaingU offers a unique stay for travellers wishing to get closer to the unspoilt wilderness of the 'real' Africa, experience the warm and welcoming people of Zambia and enjoy wildlife and scenery undisturbed.

The lodge, located on the banks of the stunningly beautiful Kafue River, was built with a lot of patience, good taste and an extraordinary sense for detail. Personal attention to each and every guest makes you feel at home instantly. It is a place to unwind, indulge in fresh cuisine prepared by local Chefs and be spoilt with an abundance of activities or, if you prefer, just relax and feel the heartbeat of Africa.

Set on raised individual private wooden decks, each overlooking their own piece of the river, KaingU Safari Lodge comprises 6 double Meru-style tents with en-suite bathrooms, indoor showers and an open-air shower or bath. The tent's additional thatched roof provide extra shade. Our Finfoot family house consists of 2 bedrooms (one queen, one twin), 2 en-suite bathrooms plus outside shower and a central living area opening onto a private deck overlooking the river. It's a perfect spot for a couple with children, or a small group of friends.

Surrounded by river and stunning bush everywhere you look, the lodge's surroundings provide the perfect backdrop for a range of activities including guided game viewing, birding and fishing, river cruises and island picnics to name a few.

The friendly staff like to share their culture, stories, traditional knowledge and craftsmanship with you.



# The Kafue National Park



Covering an area of 22,500 km<sup>2</sup>, Kafue National Park is 2nd largest in Africa and comprises many diverse habitats: it is traversed by the Kafue, Lufupa, Lunga and Luansanza Rivers. The adjoining peaceful stretches of riverine vegetation, dambos and wetlands, extensive miombo woodland with seasonal floodplains and swampland in the very north and south.

Owing to this varied habitat, Kafue is blessed with one of the **highest diversities** of mammals of all national parks in the world (158 species). Wildebeest, puku, red lechwe, Defassa waterbuck, reedbuck to name a few, and roan, sable or oribi sightings are not uncommon either. There is a high density of lion, while leopard are common in the central parts; species like cheetah and wild dog are seen too.

The **birdlife** is also spectacular. Over 515 species of birds inhabit the park and surrounding areas - from wattled and crowned crane, saddle billed stork, ground hornbill, Ross's turaco, African finfoot and Pel's fishing owl.

Only after some time here in the Kafue will you realize what is missing – other game drive vehicles, people and boats. It truly is one of the last wilderness areas of Africa.

The **Kafue National Park** offers with game drives, excellent walking safaris, canoe trails, boat cruises, fishing and wonderful relaxation an unforgettable safari experience.



# Add On: Busanga Plains



Add to the Explore Kafue Package:

## +3 Nights Mukambi Plains Camp

The **Busanga Plains** are arguably the most known area in the Kafue National Park. Having said this, it is also very remote and only accessible for three to four months a year, when the water levels finally drop after the rainy season. The Busanga Swamps is a papyrus-covered wetland that gives way to the vast floodplain of the Busanga Plains, seasonally-inundated grassland dotted with tree-islands hosting wonderful specimens of sycamore fig. At the beginning of the season the plains are crowded with bird-life and still sightings of lions, often crossing the water channels, are not rare. Large herds of red lechwe and puku are a common sight, together with oribi and resident roan while zebra, wildebeest and sable use the fringes of the plains.

### MUKAMBI PLAINS CAMP

The Mukambi Plains Camp is the seasonal bush camp (open from July to November) of Mukambi Safari Lodge located deep in the heart of the Busanga Plains. It is small and intimate and consists of only four big safari tents with en-suite open air bathrooms and a raised central area or boma underneath a magnificent Fig tree. Your day usually starts with a morning game drive at first light, you will see the bush wake up and the animals catch the early sun. Around 16:00 hours your afternoon-evening game drive starts and you will explore more of the Busanga Plains. Just before sunset we'll stop for a sundowner after which you will experience the African bush at night.

### ITINERARY 9 NIGHT SAFARI:


- 1st - 3rd night: MUSEKESE CAMP; walking safaris, game drives, boating drive from Musekese to Busanga Plains Camp (3-4 hour drive)
- 4th - 6th night: MUKAMBI PLAINS CAMP; Northern Kafue; game drives in the Busanga Plains drive from Mukambi Plains Camp to KaingU Safari Lodge (note: 6 hour drive)
- 7th - 9th night: KAINGU SAFARI LODGE; river cruises, canoeing, fishing, nature & rock walks, game drives (when arriving by Air, we recommend to start the Safari at Busanga Plains Camp and end at KaingU Safari Lodge)



## Add On:

Konkamoya (lake side lodge)

/ Nanzhila Plains Safari Camp



Nestled on the banks of the Iteshi Teshi lake, Konkamoya Lodge (which in the Nianja language means "Follow the wind") has four luxurious safari tents all facing east, offering a magnificent view of the lake and the gorgeous African sunrise. A purposely small maximum number of guest allows an intimate experience with nature. Specialities are Aardvark, Cheetah and Wild dogs and maybe a chance to catch up with the famous Ngoma Buffalo herds.

The Nanzhila Plains are seasonally flooded grasslands with scattered tree-island in the southern part of the Kafue National Park. The area is best known for its lush woodlands of Miombo, Zambezi Teak and Mopane, the beautiful plains and the Nanzhila stream that runs through it. Nanzhila Plains is a must for those intrepid travellers wishing to experience life off the beaten track.
